
The scientific objectives and deliverables will be accomplished with the following understanding that are mutually agreed upon by IIL and DSU.

1. The collaboration is for one year to promote academic and industry relationship.
2. IIL agrees to pay ₹ 12 lakhs for the above said project and the funds will be disbursed quarterly.
3. The funds will be transferred to DSU as a part of Corporate Social Responsibility (CSR) of IIL.
4. The progress of research collaboration will be monitored by quarterly review.
5. First quarterly review will be through web meeting. Second quarterly meeting will be a face-to-face discussion in physical mode. Third quarterly meeting will be through web meeting. Fourth quarterly meeting will be a face-to-face discussion in physical mode.
6. The project investigators of DSU are required to submit 25 (fully characterized compounds) per month for screening purpose.
7. If required investigators may also be asked to work on possible synthetic route scouting.
8. To attain the deliverables mentioned in clause 6, DSU agree to provide necessary resources, including student researchers, laboratory facilities and equipment, administrative support for smooth implementation of the project.
9. To accomplish above goal following roles and responsibilities are allocated to investigators:



Dhanalakshmi Srinivasan University and IBM agree that all discussions between the parties regarding a potential business arrangement are nonbinding unless and until the parties enter into a written, definitive agreement signed by their duly authorized representative, and neither party shall be obligated to enter into such an agreement.

MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING

This Memorandum of Understanding ("MOU") is intended to outline a proposed business relationship between IBM India Private Limited ("IBM") with Registered offices at 12, Subramanya Arcade , Bannerghatta Road, BANGALORE - 560 029 and **Dhanalakshmi Srinivasan University** with registered address at NH-45, Trichy Chennai Trunk Road, Samayapuram (Near Samayapuram Toll Plaza), Tiruchirappalli - 621 112, Tamil Nadu.

WHEREAS, Dhanalakshmi Srinivasan University and IBM have entered into discussions concerning IBM's provision of technology products and services for Customer;

WHEREAS, the parties anticipate that Customer will elect to engage IBM as the primary and preferred technology provider for IT hosting, hardware, software and services.

NOW, THEREFORE, in order to ensure that the discussions and evaluations between parties regarding the potential business relationship that is sought does not create any confusion or misunderstandings, the following items represent points that require the parties' agreement and will facilitate these evaluations and discussions.

1. Roles and Responsibilities

The proposed roles and responsibilities of the parties in connection with this proposed business relationship are described in Attachment 1.

2. Termination

This MOU will terminate on **5 years from the date of signing** unless extended or terminated earlier. If at any time any party wishes to withdraw from further evaluations and discussions in connection with the subject matter of this MOU and terminate this MOU, it may do so with or without cause and without liability by providing the other party with written notice of its intention to withdraw from further evaluation and discussions. All discussions, proposals, term sheets, draft agreements and other similar materials will be null and void if evaluations and discussions are terminated. This MOU can be extended upon written agreement of the parties.

3. Confidentiality

The existence and substance of this MOU and the provision of services contemplated hereby will be kept confidential and will not be disclosed to any party hereto to any third party without the prior written consent of the other party hereto. Notwithstanding the foregoing, any party may make such public disclosure as it believes, on the advice of counsel, is required by law or by applicable stock exchange regulations, in which case such party will consult with the other party and gain such party's written approval prior to making such disclosure.

The parties acknowledge that the exchange of confidential information by DSU and IBM in connection with this MOU will be governed by the terms and conditions of that certain Agreement for Exchange of Confidential Information, attached hereto as Attachment 2.

4. Limitation of Liability

The parties agree that (i) the activities intended by this MOU may not be successfully completed; (ii) the results achieved may not be as anticipated; and (iii) these activities may not lead to any announced or generally available or limited offering. Any decision by any party to forego, or engage any other business opportunity, to alter or supplement any business plan of direction, or to make any investment in anticipation of the consummation of any transaction contemplated hereunder, is at the sole discretion of the party electing to do so, and will not create any actual or potential liability or any obligation for the other party, even if that party is aware of, or has been informed of, or has indicated approval of, any such action, decision, or election.

Except for a breach of Articles 3 or 5, for any claim in any way related to the subject matter of this MOU, the damaged party shall not be entitled to recover any actual and direct damages unless and until a definitive agreement has been signed. This will apply regardless of the form of action, whether in contract or in tort, including negligence. This limitation will not apply to claims for bodily injury or damage to real property or tangible personal property for which a party is legally liable. In no event will either party be liable for any lost profits, lost savings, incidental damages, or other economic consequential damages, even if advised of the possibility of such damages. In addition, neither party will be liable for any damages claimed by the other party based on any third party claim.

5. Publicity

IBM and DSU each agrees not to use the trademarks, trade names, services marks or other proprietary marks of the other party to this MOU in any advertising, press releases, publicity matters, or other promotional materials without prior written approval of the other party. In addition each party agrees not to initiate or distribute any press releases, publicity matters or other promotional materials related to or referencing the subject matter of this MOU without prior written approval of the other party.

6. Governing Law

This Memorandum of Understanding shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of India, without regard to its conflict of laws provision.

7. General

Nothing contained in this MOU will be deemed to grant any ownership in, or license to, any patents, inventions, copyrights or trademarks of either party, whether made under this MOU or not. Each party will own any intellectual property created by it during the period of the MOU. In case a party wants to use the other party's intellectual property as created above for internal purposes, it would have to acquire appropriate licenses and rights from the other party, under a separate agreement. Each party will continue to own any pre-existing material contributed by it.

8. Feedback means any comments, suggestions, and recommendations on IBM products or services of this business relationship. The other party is under no obligation to give Feedback to IBM. In case, such Feedback is made, it is not treated as confidential to the other party, and IBM shall be free to act and use such Feedback, including but not limited to IBM products or services. Any enhancements to IBM product or services based on such Feedback shall be exclusively owned by IBM. Such rights to Feedback are granted on non-exclusive basis to IBM. Third party shall not disclose such Feedback to any other party without IBM's prior written approval.

It is understood that this MOU does not purport to cover all aspects of this business relationship.

Agreement for Exchange of Confidential Information

Our mutual objective under this Agreement is to provide protection for confidential information (Information) while maintaining our ability to conduct our respective business activities. Each of us agrees that the following terms apply when one of us (Discloser) discloses Information to the other (Recipient).

1. Disclosure

Information will be disclosed either:

- 1) in writing;
- 2) by delivery of items;
- 3) by initiation of access to Information, such as may be in a data base; or
- 4) by oral or visual presentation.

Information should be marked with a restrictive legend of the Discloser. If Information is not marked with such legend or is disclosed orally, the Information will be identified as confidential at the time of disclosure.

2. Obligations

The Recipient agrees to:

- 1) use the same care and discretion to avoid disclosure, publication or dissemination of the Discloser's Information as it uses with its own similar information that it does not wish to disclose, publish or disseminate; and
- 2) use the Discloser's Information for the purpose for which it was disclosed or otherwise for the benefit of the Discloser.

The Recipient may disclose Information to:

- 1) its employees who have a need to know, and employees of any legal entity that it controls, controls it, or with which it is under common control, who have a need to know. Control means to own or control, directly or indirectly, over 50% of voting shares; and
- 2) any other party with the Discloser's prior written consent.

Before disclosure to any of the above parties, the Recipient will have a written agreement with the party sufficient to require that party to treat Information in accordance with this Agreement.

The Recipient may disclose Information to the extent required by law. However, the Recipient will give the Discloser prompt notice to allow the Discloser a reasonable opportunity to obtain a protective order.

3. Confidentiality Period

Information disclosed under this Agreement will be subject to this Agreement for two years following the initial date of disclosure.

4. Exceptions to Obligations

The Recipient may disclose, publish, disseminate, and use Information that is:

- 1) already in its possession without obligation of confidentiality;
- 2) developed independently;
- 3) obtained from a source other than the Discloser without obligation of confidentiality;
- 4) publicly available when received, or subsequently becomes publicly available through no fault of the Recipient; or
- 5) disclosed by the Discloser to another without obligation of confidentiality.

The Recipient may use in its business activities the ideas, concepts and know-how contained in the Discloser's Information which are retained in the memories of Recipient's employees who have had access to the Information under this Agreement.

5. Disclaimers

THE DISCLOSER PROVIDES INFORMATION WITHOUT WARRANTIES OF ANY KIND.

The Discloser will not be liable for any damages arising out of the use of Information disclosed under this Agreement.

Neither this Agreement nor any disclosure of Information made under it grants the Recipient any right or license under any trademark, copyright or patent now or subsequently owned or controlled by the Discloser.

The Recipient will 1) comply with all applicable export and import laws and regulations, including associated embargo and sanction regulations, and 2) unless authorized by applicable governmental license or regulation, not directly or indirectly export or re-export any technical information or software subject to this Agreement (including direct products of such technical information or software) to any prohibited destination or country (including release to nationals, wherever they may be located, of any prohibited country) as specified in such applicable export regulations. This paragraph will survive the termination or expiration of this Agreement and the confidentiality period above and will remain in effect until fulfilled.

Only a written agreement signed by both of us can modify this Agreement.

Either of us may terminate this Agreement by providing one month's written notice to the other. Any terms of this Agreement which by their nature extend beyond its termination remain in effect until fulfilled, and apply to respective successors and assignees.

Both of us consent to the application of the laws of India to govern, interpret, and enforce all of your and our rights, duties, and obligations arising from, or relating in any manner to, the subject matter of this Agreement, without regard to conflict of law principles.

This Agreement is the complete and exclusive agreement regarding our disclosures of Information, and replaces any prior oral or written communications between us regarding these disclosures. 

- ii. Dhanalakshmi Srinivasan University (DSU), Tiruchirappalli.(hereinafter represented by its representative Dr.M.Ravichandran, Registrar, Dhanalakshmi Srinivasan University, Tiruchirappalli)

The parties have executed an agreement of cooperation in 18th July, 2022.

- i. This agreement shall come into force with immediate effect for the purpose of exploring the areas of cooperation benefitting both Dlithe and DSU.
- ii. The agreement shall terminate by common consent, upon which the areas of cooperation, as set out under the said agreement, shall forthwith cease and all other duties, obligations or rights of the parties under the said agreement shall terminate without prejudice. To the rights accrued and obligations incurred by the parties till the date of termination, which shall remain unaffected.


2. Area of cooperation under the agreement:

8. DSU shall provide Consultancy Services to Dlithe through its faculty in their areas of expertise.
9. Dlithe shall extend their services to DSU as and when required.
10. Dlithe shall assist DSU in setting up Industry Based Labs, Centre of Excellence etc. in their areas of expertise.
11. DSU shall provide all the necessary facilities such as Computer Lab, Internet, Classroom and Seminar Room etc. to carry out the above assignments.

3. Intellectual Property Rights:

The ownership of any product, proprietary information, processes, and utilities including any Dlithe proprietary products shall always remain with Dlithe.

4. **Confidentiality:** Each party shall maintain complete confidentiality of any information of the other, disclosed during the term of this Agreement either directly or indirectly in any form whatsoever.



5. Neither this agreement, nor any activities described herein, shall be construed as creating a partnership, joint venture, agency or other such relationship. Both parties agree that this Agreement represents a nonexclusive relationship between the parties, and nothing contained herein shall preclude either party from participating/initiating similar relationship with third parties.

6. Neither party shall issue any press release, public announcement or other such disclosure concerning this agreement without the other party's prior written consent as to such release or announcement.

7. This agreement may not be amended without the prior written consent of both the parties. This agreement shall be effective for three years from 18th July 2022 to 17th July 2025.

8. This agreement can be renewed based on mutual convenience.

9. **Termination:** Either party can cancel or terminate this Agreement unilaterally (and without reason), by giving an advance written notice of two months to the other.







The parties shall be excused from delays in performing or from failing to perform its obligations under this Agreement or the indentures pursuant thereof to the extent the delays or failures result from causes beyond the reasonable control of the parties, including, but not limited to: acts of God; wars; Governmental actions; fire; flood; epidemic; and freight embargoes. However, there shall be an obligation on such repudiating party to give notice to the other regarding the invocation of the Force Majeure clause at the earliest possible.

NOW THESE PRESENTS WITNESSETH AND IT IS HEREBY AGREED BY AND BETWEEN THE PARTIES HERETO AS FOLLOWS:

1. Scope of the Agreement

- 1.2. DSU agrees to cooperate and provide the solicited inputs, infrastructure support etc. to L&T.
- 1.3. DSU and L&T has agreed to provide the CollegeConnect Series to the students of DSU in phases as set out in Annexure – 1 of this Agreement. The list of courses, unit price etc., is set out in Annexure – 1.

- 1.7. The Parties shall set up a committee consisting of two members from each Party, who shall monitor the progress under this Agreement on a periodic basis.

2. Payment Terms

- a. DSU shall pay L&T for the CollegeConnect Program offered by L&T for 2,500 Number of Licenses at a unit rate of Rs 6,000 + GST. The detailed payment terms are as set out in in Annexure-1.
- b. DSU shall pay L&T for the CollegeConnect Program offered by L&T in a manner as set out in Annexure-1.
- c. DSU will pay the Base Amount fees to L&T as an advance after signing of this Agreement prior to enrolment of students and will pay the balance fees in the manner set out in Annexure-1 of this Agreement
- d. The Invoice shall be raised by L&T. DSU shall make payment for enrolling students as indicated in the Terms & Conditions (Annexure-1). The roll-out for the learners shall commence only after receipt of payment for the semester.
- e. Prices of the CollegeConnect Program is excluding any taxes and duties. All the taxes and duties are extra and payable by the DSU as per the statutory norms and at the rates prevailing from time to time.





- d. In the event of any termination, the ongoing CollegeConnect Program shall be rendered to the students who had enrolled for the same prior to the termination of this Agreement.
